Agenda:

Kathy introduced Eric Altena area Fisheries Manager with Fish & Wildlife. He gave a very interesting presentation. The highlights were the following:

Walleye fingerlings have been stock as recently as 2023 and will only be stocked again if there is a surplus at the end of stocking season. He stressed that we should help educate fisher people that it is best to take female sunfish and to throw back the large male sunfish. It has been shown that this will help maintain larger fish in the population. He also emphasized the need to encourage people to keep northern pike when caught. He recommends checking out "The Only Northern Pike Fillet Tutorial You'll Ever Need!" on YouTube. As well as teaching how to fillet a northern it also explains how to clean the slime off the fish.

Carol Jones extended an invitation for all ladies to join our book club. Club meets every six weeks with a break during the summer and they have read 34 books over the past few years.

Sadly, this year we had the passing of three long time residents on the lake: Butch Sobaszkiewiez, Arlene Sullivan and Butch Clark. Our condolences to all the families.

Rick Jones had hand outs available to sign up for a CORED alert system for storm warnings specific to your address. Kathy and several of our association alternates met with the DNR it has been determined that the lake is too shallow for a fishing pier to be workable on our lake. It would need to extend too far out into the lake. Kathy encouraged everyone to visit our Facebook page which has recently been updated by Nancy Schlee and also our web page for all the latest information. The Little Library is on Inspiration Trail and you are invited to "Take a Book/Leave a Book". The weed stick at the public access is a great tool for cleaning off weeds before and after leaving the lake. Kathy did a quick recap of the reasons to become a member of the Lake Beauty Association.

The positions of President, Vice President and Secretary/Treasurer are all open for replacement in 2025. There will be free hookup and 3 months of free internet as will as free from the road to your home if you are signed up by the deadline of January 1, 2025.

Mary Stocco suggested that we raise our donation to Lake Beauty Bible Camp from \$500 to \$750 for the 2025 fireworks. The motion was seconded by Christie Garlets.

Up next was Greg Fredricks with a demonstration on how to keep and manage bee hives. He is not a commercial bee keeper and does not use chemicals. He orders his bees as well as a Queen bee which has to be kept away from the drones and workers for 3 days and then released or they will kill the Queen. His bees produce about 100 gallons of crystallized honey which he does not sell, but he does give it away. Enough though it is free, he does however ask that you would kindly give a donation to the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation.
